

## Sunday 9 July

The individual triathlon race will start at 11.50am.

- A full road closure of all the roads marked in red will be in effect from **11.30am-4.00pm**.
- Rue du Portelet and Route de la Lague will be closed from **8.00am until 5.30pm** for barriers to be set up.
- In the closed roads no vehicular access (including bicycles) will be permitted whilst events are taking place, not even to access or egress properties, businesses or parking areas. The **only** exception will be access for emergency vehicles.
- Pedestrian access will be available, but those walking are asked to take care, particularly when races are taking place, and to follow instructions of the Guernsey Police, Civil Protection Officers and marshals who are there to look after everyone's safety.
- There will be an access point with two way vehicular crossing at the Longfrie filter. There will also be a one way crossing at Rue des Fosses exiting across Rue de Manoir on to Rue de la Corbiere leading to Forest Church.
- These crossings will be manned by Guernsey Civil Protection who will direct traffic and allow crossing when it is safe to do so.
- There will be access to Morrisons from St Peter's filter/Rue de La Corderie, exiting at Route de la Tourelle. This will be controlled by Guernsey Civil Protection. There will be very limited vehicular access. Please park nearby and walk in where possible.
- As soon as all competitors are on the run route, the cycling route will be re-opened.



## Monday 10 July

The time trial starts outside the old L'Eree Hotel at 9.30am.

- The roads in red will be closed from 9am until 1pm. If you need to leave your property, you will need to do so before **8.45am**.
  - Pedestrian access will be available, but those walking are asked to take care, particularly when races are taking place, and to follow instructions of the Guernsey Police, Civil Protection Officers and marshals who are there to look after everyone's safety.
  - The routes will be fully marshaled throughout
  - Please note there will be no vehicular access to the coast road from The Imperial Hotel junction to and including Hournet Lane
  - No vehicular access or egress from properties will be permitted whilst racing cyclists are on your part of the course
  - The **only** exception will be access for emergency vehicles
  - The race will finish just before the St Peter's Post Office at the top of L'Eree Hill. There will be no access to L'Eree Hill from St Peters Post Office onwards (Route Des Adams, Route Des Paysans and Route De Longfrie)
  - The roads will be fully opened from **1pm** with staggered opening from the Puffin and Oyster once the last rider passes through (approximately 12.30pm)
- The medal ceremony will be held St Peter's Church at approximately 1.30pm. Access to Styx will be from late afternoon.



## Wednesday 12 July

- The roads shown in red will be shut from **8.30am**
- There will be limited access to La Houquette School till 8.45am and the school will work with parents regarding the school drop off
- We highly recommend that all business and resident movements are completed before **8.15am**
- The **only** exception will be access for emergency vehicles
- Pedestrian access will be available, but those walking are asked to take care, particularly when races are taking place, and to follow instructions of the Guernsey Police, Civil Protection Officers and marshals who are there to look after everyone's safety
- The routes will be fully marshaled throughout

There will be limited access points for vehicles. These areas will be staffed by Police Officers, marshals and Civil Protection who will control the traffic flow.

From the Forest (blue lines on the map):

- Way in – Rue des Heches via marshal-controlled access from the Mallard junction
- Way out – Rue des Fosses exiting across Rue de Manoir on to Rue de la Corbiere leading to Forest Church
- Any vehicles who exit at these points will only be able to travel in an anti-clockwise direction on the circuit route

From St Peter's (green lines on the map):

- Way in – via Rue St. Pierre, Longfrie Crossroads, turning right into Les Grandes Rue
- Way out – Camps Massey, Rue Carriax and Clos Landais
