Any person of full age (20 years or over) shall be eligible to hold the office of Constable provided that: (a) he is ordinarily resident in this Island on the date of his nomination and he has been of

  - (ii) for a period or periods of at least five years in the aggregate at any time before that date;
- (b) he shall be ordinarily resident in the Parish at the date of his nomination;
- (c) he has not at any time during the five years immediately preceding the date of his election have been sentenced for an offence by a court in the United Kingdom, any of the Channel Islands or the Isle of Man, to imprisonment for a period of six months or more (whether suspended or not) without the option of a fine, unless that sentence was quashed or reduced to less than six months on appeal.
